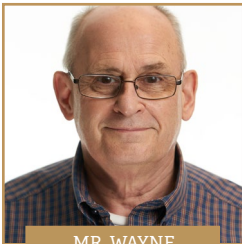

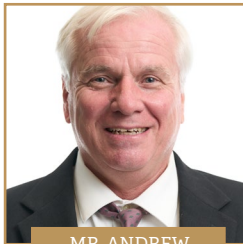

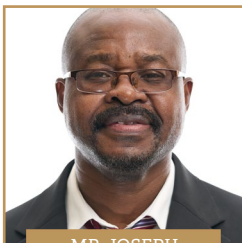

I. MISSION & METHODS

Missouri Torah Institute is a yeshiva high school geared towards **ambitious young men** who are looking to **excel as lomdei Torah** and achieve great heights in personal growth, while receiving a well-rounded secular education.

Our unique approach to chinuch is rooted in the mesorah of our rebbeim and the Torah understanding that people develop to their **maximum** when three main areas of their total well-being are engaged:

- a) **Neshama (spiritually):** through warm, relatable rebbeim who engage and encourage growth in ruchniyus and yiras shomayim through limud haTorah, as well as a love for yahadus and Klal Yisroel;
- b) **Mind (intellectually):** by providing stimulating shiurim which challenge each talmid to fully engage in limud haTorah, along with a strong secular studies program for maximum intellectual involvement;
- c) **Heart (emotionally):** by creating a positive culture and happy environment, encouraging self-awareness, ensuring a balance between structure and space, and providing creative energy outlets.

Our school operates with the Torah understanding that self-knowledge and self-respect fuel achievement and satisfaction. When a person is in tune with his strengths – and also his challenges – it provides him with his best possible advantage to excel in key areas, and to address and overcome challenges with the greatest confidence. Growth in this way can only occur when a person feels comfortable and secure in his environment. Our expert rebbeim and faculty are uniquely qualified to help our students gain self-knowledge and self-respect, and to provide them with the right balance of structure and space for this process to succeed.

MTI is uniquely structured to capitalize on every student's strengths, by placing them in shiurim and classes based on their capability. This environment allows them to mature academically, socio-emotionally (middos), and in the depth and breadth of their grasp of Torah, ruchniyus, and yiras shomayim. This model allows each person the unrestrained opportunity to challenge his own potential in every academic subject, and to excel. Through their own effort, our talmidim gain true confidence, a love for Hashem, love of learning, and love of themselves. MTI is proud of producing happy, healthy bnei Torah.

Our mesivta prides itself on its **strong bond with our bais medrash program**. Bochorim from our bais medrash share a deep, natural sense of commitment and camaraderie with our mesivta talmidim, learning side-by-side with them and interacting with them socially and spiritually, while mentoring them and demonstrating a most **admirable example of well-rounded bnei Torah**.

MTI is an affiliate of the renowned Yeshiva Chofetz Chaim, whose mesorah proudly promotes the development of a strong approach to limud haTorah b'iyun, limud hamussar, and a lifelong rebbe-talmid relationship. **The primacy of middos tovos and derech erez stressed in the yeshiva develops young men into responsible, respectable members of society.**

Our alumni choose a life of Torah, whether pursuing a life in chinuch and harbotzas haTorah or a professional career.

The community of Chesterfield provides a close-knit locale with a high quality of life and deep-rooted values, and is home to our magnificent, state-of-the-art campus, providing our talmidim with nothing short of a five-star experience.



II. EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY, על פי דרכו

MTI's educational philosophy is rooted in the classic principle of “חנוך לנער על פי דרכו”. We offer our students **multiple shiur tracks** and secular subject levels to suit **varying learning levels and styles**, providing the challenge needed to foster mastery of the material as well as the acquisition of critical life skills. This educational method promotes self-confidence in all students and encourages camaraderie and interaction between students of all ages.

*We believe the healthy intellectual challenges that students face at MTI test who they are, **compelling them to rise to the occasion** and produce positive results. These outcomes become a source of pride to our students, **strengthening them at their core** and fueling successful futures.*



III. MENAHEL AND REBBEIM



Our mesivta is led by our esteemed menahel, **Rabbi Menachem Wachsman**, who has a deep understanding of each talmid and fosters a positive and supportive environment that encourages growth and success.

Rabbi Wachsman leads our **exceptional rebbeim** who are **talmidei chachomim** and Torah leaders in **character and in knowledge**; well versed and trained in chinuch; and committed to the guiding educational philosophy of the yeshiva. Our rebbeim are **young and vibrant, warm and approachable**, and work with sincere dedication to help each student succeed. Their proficiency in the material, combined with their sense of mission in helping build **tomorrow's leaders of Klal Yisroel, makes them truly exceptional**.

Our staff strives to create a healthy balance between **structure and personal space**, which we believe is the key to success in the adolescent years. The understanding and acceptance they show the boys foster a relationship of **mutual trust and respect**.



IV. DUAL CURRICULUM – ENGAGING THE MIND

Limudei Kodesh

Rebbeim work with the talmidim, engaging their whole minds, and building deep, analytical thinking skills. Their goal is to instill a love of learning in each student and foster his growth into a complete ben Torah and a successful, proud Jew.

Limudei Kodesh Subject Areas Include:

Gemara, Iyun: Shiurim are interactive and dynamic, guiding talmidim to deeply understand the Gemara, and inculcating the skill of in-depth analysis in limud haTorah.

Gemara, Bekiyus: Shiurim are fast-paced, exposing students to Gemara concepts and patterns and giving them a breadth of Gemara knowledge.

Halacha: Shiurim cover topics that include the halachos of daily living, brachos, tefillah, Shabbos, Yom Tov, and kibud av v'em.

Chumash: Shiurim focus on skills as well as hashkafa and mussar haTorah.

Mussar: Shiurim and discussions, based on the classic mussar seforim, are learned daily. In addition, there is a weekly shmues given by one of the rebbeim to the whole yeshiva. Mussar helps talmidim understand themselves and the Jewish neshama, and **what it means to be a Jew**, both personally and as part of the broader community.



Tribute to **HaRav Henoch Leibowitz, zt”l**

Missouri Torah Institute was founded at the behest of HaRav Henoch Leibowitz, the late Rosh HaYeshiva of Rabbinical Seminary of America- Yeshivas Chofetz Chaim in Queens. His life was committed to building Torah in America. MTI was his last yeshiva project before his petirah in 2008. Our yeshiva is dedicated to his legacy.



General Studies

Our general studies department is led by **Rabbi Shimshon Gewirtz**, a ben Torah who is exceptionally knowledgeable, organized, professional, and insightful. Under his leadership, students in dual-curriculum academic programs learn to **manage multiple demands and succeed**, gaining a **competitive advantage** throughout their lives. MTI students engage in a rigorous, college-preparatory general studies education program that is accredited by Cognia and exceeds the State of Missouri's high school graduation requirements. MTI's teachers are experienced in their respective content areas, enabling them to maintain a high standard of education.

MTI's general studies program is designed to prepare students for success beyond high school, focusing on the skills students need to succeed in the 21st century. Our curriculum is based on the ACT College and Career Readiness Standards, as well as national content-area standards. We administer a battery of tests based on these standards to measure the success of our students and the program. Students utilize the experience gained from these tests, along with the valuable data they provide, in conjunction with on-campus test-prep offerings, to prepare for competitive scoring on the ACT exams in the 11th and 12th grades.

In keeping with MTI's philosophy, our general studies program places students in courses that best accommodate their varying learning styles and levels. We offer AP courses in math, English, science, and history, as well as dual-credit courses that provide college credit through the University of Missouri-St. Louis (UMSL).



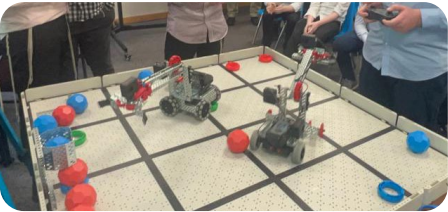
V. CHESED

Chazal teach us that chesed is one of the defining characteristics of Klal Yisroel. At MTI, the students learn about the paramount importance of chesed, giving to others, and helping them in whatever way they need. The student-run MTI Chesed Initiative organizes numerous chesed activities, giving our students opportunities to act upon this knowledge, and become giving and generous with their time and talents. Hands-on activities include packing and delivering for Tomchei Shabbos, participating in local blood drives, staffing community kiruv events, sukkah building, and visiting residents of local senior homes.

VI. ELECTIVES

MTI firmly believes that an atmosphere is conducive to growth when **structure is balanced with space**. In addition to our academic program, we offer clubs and electives that allow talmidim to explore skills and talents beyond the traditional curriculum. These programs are targeted to students' interests and change from year

to year. Some past and current offerings include **robotics, stocks & finance, safrus, broadcasting, archery, coding, guitar band, chess club, CPR, basketball, art classes focusing on different modalities, bookbinding, woodworking, self-defense/Krav Maga, choir, culinary arts, makerspace, home repair, and math club**.



VII. BAIS MEDRASH PROGRAM



MTI's post-mesivta bais medrash program is renowned for **enhancing a bochur's learning capabilities** and his **love for limud haTorah**. The **warm and engaging** environment of the MTI bais medrash is its hallmark, and the bochurim build lifelong relationships with the rebbeim during this unique part of their lives. The enveloping warmth and love of Torah that characterizes the MTI bais

medrash program are actively shared with the mesivta talmidim in their learning at night seder. This mentoring relationship provides the mesivta talmidim with **inspirational role models**, and, in turn, provides the bais medrash bochurim with a firm **sense of responsibility** to their younger charges. This symbiosis is a source of pride to the entire MTI family.

General Studies Subject Areas Include:

English Language Arts: The four-year English Language Arts program helps students understand language and use it effectively in both written and spoken communication, exposing them to a diverse selection of American and international works. In addition to our regular English classes, the program includes AP English Literature and AP English Language.

Mathematics: The four-year program consists of multiple tracks and includes courses such as Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, AP Statistics, and two years of AP Calculus.

Science: The four-year course of study includes laboratory components and hands-on exploration. Courses include Biology, Chemistry, Physics, AP Physics, AP Chemistry, college-credit Anatomy, and AP Computer Science Principles.

Social Studies: The four-year Social Studies program comprises courses that offer thoughtful insights into real-world issues, including American Government, Personal Finance, American and World History, Economics, AP Human Geography, AP US History, and AP European History.





VIII. LOCALE

Chesterfield, a serene suburb of St. Louis, provides an ideal backdrop for our yeshiva. The overall culture of the city has a classic, small-town feel, with core values that make Chesterfield a safe and wholesome place to thrive. The local Jewish community is vibrant, warm, and welcoming, and is home to the complete infrastructure of a frum community, from kosher establishments to day schools and kollelim.

IX. MAGNIFICENT CAMPUS

MTI is located on a 120,000 square-foot, multi-building, sunlit, state-of-the-art campus. The property is equipped with:

X. DORMITORY FACILITIES

MTI's beautiful, self-contained campus offers state-of-the-art dormitory rooms in its student housing wing, featuring bright skylights in common areas with couches and lounging areas, a commercial laundry facility, barbershop, and an infirmary. Each room comfortably houses 3-4 bochurim.



Student housing is administered under the caring and careful auspices of **Rabbi Avrohom Lieberman**, the MTI Dorm Mashgiach. Rabbi Lieberman's role is to assist with the **transition from home life to student housing**, and help talmidim **accept new responsibilities** like keeping their personal space neat, and balancing academic demands with recreational outlets. He is always available to the students for guidance and support. If health concerns arise, he will arrange doctor or specialist visits.

A team of dorm counselors oversees the talmidim during free time, to ensure that the environment is **positive and productive**, even outside of school. Dorm counselors accompany the students on trips when there are no classes, such as Friday afternoons, Motzei Shabbosim, and Sunday afternoons.



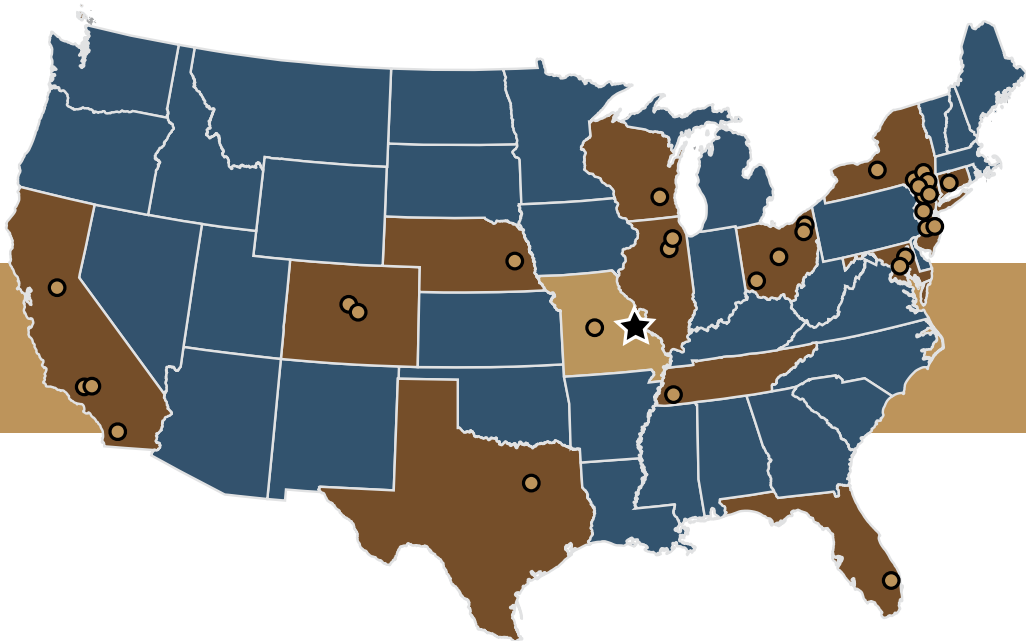
XI. MEALS

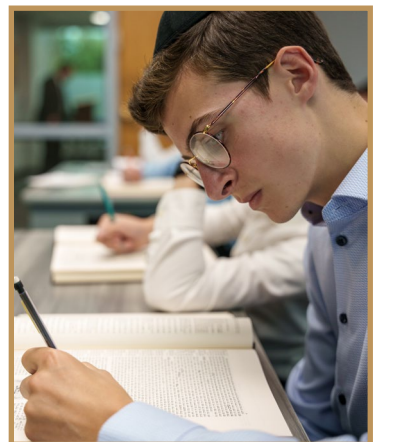
