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FEATURED TORAH Message

We now find ourselves halfway between Pesach and Shavuos, every night counting ספירת. There is a question that is asked by many ראשונים - why do we not say ספירת העומר on the ספירת העומר? We generally make a שהחיינו upon the first time doing a מצוה that season. Among the many answers given is an answer given by the רידב"ז that we do not say שהחיינו on a מצוה that is a הכנה for another מצוה. He explains that ספירת העומר " שבעה שבועות תספור says פסוק like the שבועות says הכנה " "לך מהחל חרמש הקמה... ועשית חג שבועות לה' אלוקיך. When you make the שבועות on שהחיינו it counts for both שבועות and שבועות. In the words of the אהריל, we don't make a שהחיינו because it is a הכשר מצוה and the מצוה culminates on שבועות which is when we recite שהחיינו. But how does counting these days prepare us for קבלת התורה?

The ספירת ספר החינוך explains that the idea of counting ספר החינוך is in order for us to show how excited we are, how much desire we have, and how we love the תורה so much that we can't wait until we get the תורה. We have to use this time of counting each day to make ourselves

This week's parsha starts by saying אמור אל הכהנים בני אהרן ואמרת אלהם לנפש לא יטמא בעמיו". Why does the תורה and אמור?

Rashi in Yevamos says that the reason it says אמור and ואמרת is to teach the בהנים that not only should they not become אמא, but also that they should teach their children not to become אמא.

This week, Rabbi Yaakov Bender spoke at yeshiva. He quoted Rabbi Yaakov Weinberg who asked an interesting question on this. Through אמור, the Torah is teaching us to be מתוך our children. Why did the Torah specifically use this mitzvah that בהנים should be careful not to become אמא as an example of something to tell to their children? Why not use other significant mitzvos, like אבת?

He answered by saying that the בהנים are special right from when they are born, in that they are taught not to become אמא and to be more dignified than the rest of the nation. Just as the בהנים teach their children to be dignified, to stay away from becoming אמא, and to be different than everyone else, so too all of us should
